- Innovative and Adaptable: MYP/DP teachers embrace innovation, adapting methods and incorporating technology to enhance engagement and learning outcomes.
- Reflective Practitioner: They regularly reflect on their practices and seek feedback to improve their effectiveness.
- Cultivator of Positive Culture: They establish a safe, respectful space that motivates students to take risks and fosters a sense of community.
