- Liaise closely with the Secondary School to promote seamless transition from PYP to
- Ensure that the English language program aligns with the transdisciplinary context of the PYP.
- Manage resources and develop teacher awareness of resources and expectations.
- Coordinate with EAL teachers to arrange in-class and pull-out support for students that need additional support.
- Collaborate with teachers to create inclusive instructional strategies that support students with EAL needs in mainstream classes.
