High Quality Learning and Teaching	<ul> <li>Design and implement engaging, inquiry-based units that challenge students to explore, investigate, and construct knowledge through hands-on experiences and critical thinking.</li> <li>Utilize a variety of instructional strategies and assessment methods to meet the unique needs of all learners.</li> <li>Empower students to take agency in their learning by encouraging curiosity, goal setting, and reflection on their educational journey.</li> <li>Create opportunities for students to collaborate, share ideas, and lead discussions, fostering a sense of responsibility, community, and independence.</li> <li>Establish a welcoming, inclusive classroom culture that values diversity, respect, and empathy.</li> <li>Assist in the management of classroom discipline through positive reinforcement.</li> <li>Reflect on and assess the effectiveness of instructional strategies, seeking feedback from colleagues and students to inform continuous improvement.</li> </ul>
